2021 VSBA High School Student Video Contest Winners Announced

November 17, 2021 - The Virginia School Boards Association's (VSBA) tenth annual student video contest challenged high school students across Virginia to create a 30-second video around the theme of "Virginia Public Schools: Stronger Than Ever." This year's contest was proudly sponsored by Haney Phinyowattanachip PLLC. The first, second and third place winners, selected out of 28 submissions, were announced today at the first general session of the VSBA Annual Convention in Williamsburg, VA, and the first place video was shown to the convention's attendees. The videos were reviewed by a panel of judges from within the video production field. The judges stated that the first-place video showed "a high level of production, with a fast paced and eye catching concept that had a good message that had a great balance. You can tell they put a lot of time and energy into it."
